<u>The Indispensable Work of the Holy Spirit in Ministry</u>

INTRODUCTION (John 14: 12-17)

I. THE PERSONS CALLED TO DO MINISTRY (v.12)

"he that believeth on me." The word 'believeth' in this context carries a profound meaning. It signifies having faith in, upon, or for a person or thing and entrusting one's spiritual well-being to Christ.

II. THE PRIMARY REASON JESUS ASSIGNED THE WORK TO BELIEVERS (v. 12).

- 1. Believers are the only ones who know Christ personally and who have the same passion for doing His work.
- 2. Believers are the only ones spiritually equipped to do the work.
- 3. Jesus was returning to the Father (v. 12; Acts 1: 8-9).

III. THE PROMISE TO THE ONE WHO BELIEVES (v. 12)

- 1. The believer shall do the same and even greater works than Jesus did.
- 2. The believer shall have his prayers answered (vv. 13-14; Psalm 29:2; Psalm 100:4.)
- 3. The believer shall receive the Holy Spirit to empower him to do the work (vs. 15-17).
 - (1) The Holy Spirit is promised to those who believe in, love, and obey Christ (v. 15).
 - (2) The Father would give the Holy Spirit in answer to Jesus' prayer (v. 16).
 - (3) The Holy Spirit would be a Helper to the believer. The word "Comforter" in the Greek is 'parakletos. It means summoned to one's side, especially to one's side to aid. In the broadest sense, a helper, an assistant.
 - (4) The Holy Spirit is the Spirit of Truth (v. 17; John 16: 13).
 - (5) The Holy Spirit is not known by the world but is known by believers.
 - (6) The Holy Spirit is now dwelling in every believer to empower him to do the work that Christ did *(Ref. Acts 2).*

IV. CONCLUSION

- 1. There is no excuse for not doing Christ's work.
- 2. Are we doing Christ's work? If not, we must repent, confess, receive God's forgiveness, and then get busy.
