Jesus' Teaching Concerning Forgiveness

I. THE QUESTION (v. 21). How often should we forgive someone?

- 1. The question was private (v. 21 "Then came Peter to him.")
- 2. Peter's question was not just a question but a reflection of a struggle that we all face.
- 3. Peter's question was not just a question but a demonstration of what he considered a generous spirit. He asked, "Should I forgive my brother seven times?"

II. THE ANSWER (v. 22)

- 1. Jesus' response was undoubtedly not what Peter or most people today would have expected when forgiving a wrong.
- Jesus' answer tells us that forgiveness must be limitless.
- 3. To drive home his point, Jesus then tells a parable called "The Parable of the Unmerciful Servant."

III. THE PARABLE (vs. 23-35)

- 1. Forgiveness is required regardless of the debt owed (v. 24).
- 2. Forgiveness comes through compassion (v. 27).
- 3. An unforgiving spirit comes when one leaves the Lord (v. 28).
- 4. An unforgiving spirit comes from a hard and selfish heart.
- 5. God is angry with those who refuse to forgive (v. 34).
- 6. God will punish those who refuse to forgive (v. 35).

IV. CONCLUSION

- 1. In Matthew 5 in the Beatitudes, Jesus says, "Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy."
- 2. In our Lord's model prayer, he states, "Forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us.
- 3. Ephesians 4:32
