INTRODUCTION - Phil. 3:1-3

I. THEIR DESCRIPTION

- A. He refers to them as dogs, evil workers, and the concision (Phil. 3: 2)
- B. Their end or destiny is destruction (v. 19)
- C. Their god is their belly (v. 19; Rom. 16:17)
- D. Their glory is in their shame (v. 19)
- E. They mind earthly things (v. 19)

II. THEIR DESIGNATION (v. 18 - "enemies of the cross of Christ")

- A. Why did Paul label them enemies of the cross of Christ rather than just the enemies of Christ?
 - 1) A profession without Christlikeness denies the power of the message of the cross (1 Cor. 1:18; Rom. 6:1-23)
 - 2) A profession without Christlikeness disregards the Person on the cross.
 - a) The cross is a reminder of Christ's love (John 15:13)
 - b) The cross serves as a reminder of the suffering He endured
 - c) The cross serves as a reminder of the devotion He deserves
 - d) The cross serves as a reminder of the completion of God's plan.
